Board of Commissioners of Candler County Regular Meeting September 14, 2020 5:00 p.m.

The Board of Commissioners of Candler County met for the regular monthly meeting on Monday, September 14, 2020, at 5:00 p.m., in the Commissioners' boardroom at 1075 East Hiawatha Street, Suite A, Metter, Georgia. Those attending the meeting were Candler County Chairman, Glyn Thrift; Vice-Chairman Brad Jones; Candler County Commissioners Wayne Culbertson, David Robinson, and Blake Hendrix; Candler County Administrator, Bryan Aasheim; Candler County Attorney, Kendall Gross; Candler County Clerk, Kellie Lank. Other guests attending the meeting included Brandon Glenn, Buck Moon, State House Representative Butch Parrish, Paul Collins, Kevin Simmons, Ann P.D. Gleason, Superior Court Judge Bobby Reeves, Johnny Singh, John Miles, Steven R. Patrick, Jenny Grimes and Justin Wells. This meeting was offered via teleconference to the public. The Metter Advertiser was represented by Jerri Goodman.

Call to Order

Chairman Thrift called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Commissioner Robinson delivered the invocation and chairman Thrift led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Amendment to the Agenda

Vice-Chairman Jones made a motion to approve the agenda with the addition of the following items. Commissioner Robinson provided a second. The motion carried 4-0.

- 4. a. Judge Robert Reeves, request for funding of audio/visual equipment
- 9. r. Consideration of a request from the Candler County Coroner for funding of an indigent cremation

Citizens Wishing to Address the Board

Judge Robert Reeves, request for funding of audio/visual equipment

Judge Reeves requested the Commissioners consider expending \$25,000 on audio/visual camera equipment to perform virtual hearings that will reduces the transport of dangerous prisoners. This purchase would need to be completed by December 31, 2020 to qualify for the 2nd Phase of COVID-19 CARES Act funding. Mr. Gross recommended, should the Commissioners move to make this purchase, there should be a liquidated damages clause in the agreement.

Ann P D Gleason, regarding her candidacy for Georgia House District 158

Ms. Ann P.D. Gleason spoke to the Commission on the main focus of her campaign. She elaborated on issues that focus on Medicaid expansion, an increase in rural broadband, as well as more development of solar energy farms.

State House Representative Butch Parrish, regarding his candidacy for reelection in Georgia House District 158

Mr. Butch Parrish appeared before the Commissioners to discuss education, economic development and rural healthcare. He commended the Commissioners for their support in these areas. Mr. Parrish expanded on Candler County educational resources naming the Candler County Pre-K thru

12 education complex, Southeastern Tech as well as neighboring colleges and technical colleges. He then recognized the economic development accomplishments of Candler County where recently Governor Brian Kemp made a visit to a well-established company located in the Candler County Industrial Park. Mr. Parrish went on to say he chairs the Subcommittee on Appropriation on Healthcare for all budgeted funds that has to do with healthcare in Georgia. This committee was instrumental in establishing the Georgia Hearts Program. Candler County Hospital received \$2,261,000.00 in dedicated state tax payments. He closed with reminding the Commissioners of the importance of participation in the 2020 Census.

Paul Collins, Glenn Davis & Associates, regarding Health Care Insurance

Mr. Collins circulated a written report that addressed the Commission regarding a motion made during the August 3, 2020 meeting selecting Hadden Insurance as the County's Insurance Broker of Record and the search for a Health Insurance Consultant. The report formally requested Glenn/Davis & Associates be reinstated effective October 1, 2020.

Brandon Glenn, Cactus Family Farms regarding Cal Maine Rd

Mr. Glenn approached the Commission requesting they consider the use of crushed gravel to areas along Cal Maine Road that ruts make it nearly impassable. After some discussion, Mr. Glenn requested the Commission consider abandonment of a portion of the road 50 feet from the paved road after the culvert to the gate of his property. Mr. Gross included there will need to be survey of the property and a plat for legal ad purposes.

The Commissioners agreed with the stipulation of holding the registration fee payments until after the registration deadline.

Financials

Administrator Aasheim delivered the August 2020 financial report. (Exhibit C)

- All accounts balanced.
- General Fund balance as of August 31, 2020 was \$1,663,418.46 which is increased due to the CARES Act funding.
- The Hospital note stands at \$1,783,907.91. The September payment was made prior to this meeting that reduced the balance to \$1,748,831.61.
- Interest earnings are down compared to 2019.
- 2018 SPLOST revenue remain up at \$122,574.17. \$54,913.23 of August proceeds were specifically allocated to Candler County.
- TAVT collections are down.

Old Business

Review and Discussion of Current Ordinances Pertaining to EMS Fees and Solid Waste Disposal

Chairman Thrift made a motion to adopt the proposed amendment to the EMS Fees and Solid Waste Disposal fees with a provision to round-up the fees according to the number of dwelling units. Commissioner Robinson provided a second. The motion carried 5-0. (Exhibit D)

Mr. Aasheim presented the completed application to the Commissioners. Commissioner Robinson made a motion to approve and add Gunhinder Singh the application for an Alcohol License to the existing license for R&J Liquor, Inc. located at 9711 Pulaski Why, Pulaski GA 30451. Commissioner Culbertson provided a second. The motion carried, 5-0.

Consideration of an application for an Alcohol License from Steven R. Patrick, Bevrick's, located at 1055 Fortner Rd, Metter GA 30439

Mr. Aasheim presented the application for an Alcohol License from Steven R. Patrick, Bevrick's, located at 1055 Fortner Rd, Metter GA 30439. CANDLER COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (E.M.S.) FEE ORDINANCE

ARTICLE ONE GENERAL

1.1 TITLE.

This Ordinance shall be known as and may be cited as the "Candler County Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) Fee Ordinance."

1.2 PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to raise revenue to offset the cost, partially or wholly, of providing economical and adequate Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) in Candler County among those who are using or may use the service.

ARTICLE TWO DEFINITIONS

2.1 **DEFINITIONS.**

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- (1) <u>Dwelling unit</u> means any structure suitable or commonly used for residential purposes by a single family or family group, and includes all single-family residences, including modular and manufactured/mobile homes, and includes each apartment, townhouse, condominium or cooperative unit of a multifamily structure.
- (2) <u>Business unit</u> means any commercial establishment, industry, professional establishment, trade or service establishment, store, organization, or enterprise, whether for profit or non-profit.
 - (A) <u>Long-Term Care Facility</u> means a nursing home or long-term care facility which is located within the territorial bounds of Candler County, Georgia.
 - (B) Recreational Vehicle Park (hereafter referred to as "RV Park") means any single parcel of land upon which two (2) or more recreational vehicles are occupied for temporary sleeping purposes, regardless of whether or not a charge is made for such purposes.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (E.M.S.) SPECIAL DISTRICT

3.1 CREATION,

In accordance with the purpose of this Ordinance, there is hereby created an Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) special district coterminous with incorporated and unincorporated areas of Candler County.

3.2 FEE FOR DWELLING UNIT.

The Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fee per dwelling unit on the owners of real property within the area of the Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) special district for each dwelling unit situated on their property.

WYNNEYCLING INIT CLASSIFIED AS NON-HOMESTEAD 3.3

In the case of each dwelling unit classified as a non-homestead manufactured/mobile home, the Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fee on the owner of each non-homestead manufactured/mobile home situated within the area of the Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) special district unless it is being levied under Section 3.2 above.

3.4 FEE FOR BUSINESS UNIT.

The Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fee per business unit on the owners of real property within the Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) special district for each business unit situated on their property.

3.4.1 FEE FOR LONG TERM CARE FACILITY.

The Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Service (E.M.S.) service fee for each long-term care facility located in Candler County, Georgia. The owner/operator of a Long-Term Care Facility shall be subject to an annual fee for the provision of Emergency Medical Services, "EMS", to the facility. The fee shall be determined by dividing the total number of patient/resident rooms available by two (2) and multiplying that number by the current commercial EMS fee imposed in Candler County, Georgia. If the division of the total number of patient/resident rooms does not equal a whole number, the number shall be rounded up for the purpose of the fee calculation.***

ARTICLE THREE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (E.M.S.) SPECIAL DISTRICT

3.1 CREATION.

In accordance with the purpose of this Ordinance, there is hereby created an Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) special district coterminous with incorporated and unincorporated areas of Candler County.

3.2 FEE FOR DWELLING UNIT.

The Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fee per dwelling unit on the owners of real property within the area of the Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) special district for each dwelling unit situated on their property.

3.3 FEE FOR DWELLING UNIT CLASSIFIED AS NON-HOMESTEAD MANUFACTURED/MOBILE HOME.

In the case of each dwelling unit classified as a non-homestead manufactured/mobile home, the Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fee on the owner of each non-homestead manufactured/mobile home situated within the area of the Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) special district unless it is being levied under Section 3.2 above.

3.4 FEE FOR BUSINESS UNIT.

The Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fee per business unit on the owners of real property within the Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) special district for each business unit situated on their property.

3.4.1 FEE FOR LONG TERM CARE FACILITY.

The Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Service (E.M.S.) service fee for each long-term care facility located in Candler County, Georgia. The owner/operator of a Long-Term Care Facility shall be subject to an annual fee for the provision of Emergency Medical Services, "EMS", to the facility. The fee shall be determined by dividing the total number of patient/resident rooms available by two (2) and multiplying that number by the current commercial EMS fee imposed in Candler County, Georgia. If the division of the total number of patient/resident rooms does not equal a whole number, the number shall be rounded up for the purpose of the fee calculation.ⁱⁱⁱ

3.4.2 FEE FOR CAMPGROUND/RECREATIONAL VEHICLE (RV) PARK.

The Board of Commissioners of Candler County, pursuant to Georgia Constitution, Article 9, Section 2, Paragraph 6, shall levy an Emergency Medical Service (E.M.S.) service fee for each campground/RV park located in Candler County, Georgia. The owner/operator of a campground/RV park shall be subject to an annual fee for the provision of Emergency Medical Services, "EMS", to the facility. The fee shall be determined by dividing the total number of patient/resident rooms available by two (2) and multiplying that number by the current commercial EMS fee imposed in Candler County, Georgia. The total of all EMS fees charged to a single campground/RV park will not exceed \$1,500 annually. (ref. Candler County RV Park & Campground Ordinance, adopted February 17, 2020.) If the division of the total number of patient/resident rooms does not equal a whole number, the number shall be rounded up for the purpose of the fee calculation. iv

3.5 ESTABLISHMENT OF SERVICE FEE AMOUNT.

The Board of Commissioners shall establish the amount of the aforementioned Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fees each year as part of its annual budget process. Funds collected from these service fees for Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) shall be expended by the Board of Commissioners in any manner deemed by it to be in the best interest of the public as determined pursuant to its lawful authority.

3.6 NEWLY ESTABLISHED AND REESTABLISHED UNITS.

The Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fees shall be immediately due and payable on a prorated basis for each dwelling unit and business unit that is newly established or being reestablished. Thereafter, the fee shall be due at the same time the ad valorem taxes are due for the subject property.

3.7 ABATEMENT.

Dwelling units and business units that meet the following requirements shall be eligible for abatement of the Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) service fee:

- (1) A dwelling unit that is not being permanently occupied shall be eligible for abatement from the service fee.
- (2) A business unit that is not in operation shall be eligible for abatement from the service fee.
- (3) Long-term care facilities and Campground/RV Parks shall not be eligible for an abatement from the service fee.

The abatement reporting period shall be from January 1st to June 1st of each year. The owner(s) of the dwelling unit or business unit shall be required to submit an Application for Abatement to the Candler County Tax Assessors office. The Application for Abatement may be for a full or partial abatement. The Chief Appraiser or his/her designee shall verify the dwelling unit or business unit qualifies for the abatement. The owner(s) shall notify the Board of Assessors in writing within thirty (30) days following a change in condition(s) that nullifies the abatement. Owner(s) shall be responsible for payment of all service fees for all years improperly abated plus penalties and interest.

3.8 PENALTY FOR LATE PAYMENT.

Any fee not paid by the due date for paying the ad valorem taxes on the subject property shall be levied interest and penalties in the same manner and rate as the ad valorem tax bill to which the fee has been attached.

ARTICLE FOUR LEGAL STATUS PROVISIONS

4.1 REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

4.2 EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on and after the date that it is enacted by the governing authority.

- 1. Company hereby agrees to install an electronic system for the Subscriber to be located on the Subscriber's premises at 25 Daniel Street Metter, Georgia 30439.
- 2. The electronic system referred to herein is described as follows: (1) IP Camera System to be connected to the Jail server and use the county network to connect to server. Southeast Fire & Burglar is not resposible for network connection back. System will include a 24 Port P.O.E and an additional 24 TB Har Drive. , (1) Cameras will be located as follows: 2 On the Southwest Corner Outside, 1 in Tax Commissioners Reception Area, 1 in Waiting Line Area, 3 in Tax Commissioners Lobby, 2 Outside at the Northwest Corner, 1 in the Multi-Purpose Room, 1 Outside looking at Front Door from Multi-Purpose Corner, 2 in Tax Assessors Office, 2 in Southeast Corner Outside, and 2 in Northeast Corner Outside. , (1) Camera Monthly Lease
- 3. Company agrees to maintain the system during the term of this agreement including replacement of any necessary parts, upon notice from Subscriber of any defect or malfunction. Subscriber agrees not to permit, in connection therewith, the attachment or use of any apparatus, which is not furnished to Company, or to utilize the services of any other party in the maintenance of this system, except as may be expressly permitted by Company in writing.
- 4 Subscriber agrees to pay company as follows:
- (a.) The equipment shall be the sum of \$2663.33 plus labor in the amount of \$1331.67 plus sales tax in the amount of \$0.00 totaling \$3995.00 for installation
- (b.) The sum of \$85.00 plus applicable sales tax per month for the following for

- (c.) Terms of payments are: Due before the 10th of each month. This agreement shall begin upon completion.
- (d.) Lease Term Length is 36 Months.
- 5. The initial period of this agreement shall be <u>36 Months</u> from the date hereof and this agreement shall be renewed automatically on a month to month basis after the initial term. Subscriber must give written notice of cancellation with at least thirty (30) days notice. Company has the right to cancel at any time without notice. All equipment listed in paragraph two (2) shall remain property of company and shall be removed upon termination. A new Subscriber can reinstate this agreement upon Company approval.

Upon request Company shall service the alarm system described herein within ninety-six (96) hours of notice of any defect therein provided Subscriber furnishes access to the premises during said entire ninety-six (96) hour period. It is hereby agreed that the entire electronic system and all parts thereof installed by Company shall remain in the same location as installed and any removal or disturbance thereof resulting from altering, remodeling, or painting of the premises of fixtures or any changes whatsoever necessitating any work by

way of repairs shall be paid for by Subscriber in accordance with the standard charges of Company. Company reserves the right at any time to remove the system and install a comparable system performing substantially the same services in a similar manner. Subscriber hereby authorizes and empowers Company, and its agents, to enter said premises to install, test, repair, and service the system.

- 8. Company is hereby authorized to make any preparation such as driving holes, driving nails, making attachments, or doing any acts necessary to the proper installation and maintenance of the electronic system, and Company shall not be responsible for any condition created thereby during the installation, maintenance, or removal of the equipment, nor shall Company be responsible for any condition of the premises upon the removal of the system and Subscriber warrants that it has full authority to permit the installation of the apparatus under the conditions stated herein, and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Company for any liability which may be asserted against Company as the result of such installation or removal.
- 9. Subscriber agrees, in case of loss or damage to the electronic system from any act of negligence of Subscriber or Subscriber's agents, or in case of any damage thereto by fire, accident or other casualty of any kind, to indemnify and repay Company the cost of repairing or replacing the equipment, ordinary wear and tear excluded.
- 10. If any governmental instrumentality, or Subscriber, shall require or make necessary any changes in the system as originally installed, Subscriber agrees to pay on demand the customary charges of Company for such changes. Any waiver of a breach of any term of this contract by Company shall not be deemed a waiver of any rights or remedies Company may have as to any other breach of this contract.
- 12. Company shall be held harmless by Subscriber for any loss or damage to Subscriber caused by delay, interruption, or stoppage in construction or maintenance caused by strikes, accidents, governmental interference, acts of God, or any other causes beyond the control of Company, and any such events shall not relieve Subscriber of the obligation to make all payments required by this agreement.
- 13. IT IS AGREED THAT COMPANY IS NOT AN INSURER OR GUARANTOR AGAINST LOSS BY SUBSCRIBER, NOR DOES COMPANY WARRANT THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE SYSTEM, AND THAT THE PAYMENTS PROVIDED FOR HEREIN ARE BASED SOLELY ON THE VALUE OF THE SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED IN THE INSTALLATION, MAINTENANCE, AND REPAIR OF THE SYSTEM. Company does not undertake to guarantee Subscriber against any loss or damage by reason of any burglary, theft, fire, or any other cause, and Subscriber agrees that Company shall not be liable for any loss occasioned thereby nor by negligence or oversight on the part of Company in the installation or maintenance of the system nor by the failure of the electronic system to function properly, and Subscriber further agrees to indemnify and hold Company harmless from and against any and all claims or demands for injury to persons which may be asserted against Company by Subscriber or by others arising out of the installation and/or maintenance of the electronic system whether due to Company's negligence or otherwise. This paragraph shall be effective notwithstanding any other provision of this agreement and if there should be, notwithstanding the provisions of this paragraph, any liability on the part of Company by virtue of this agreement, whether due

to the misfeasance, nonfeasance, negligence of the Company or otherwise, such liability is shall limited to a sum equal to \$250.00. If Subscriber wishes to assume a limited liability in lieu of the liquidated damages as hereinabove set forth.

Company is not responsible for any failures that may arise or any cost that involves installing a cellular dialer.

If services are disconnected by customer service order or for non-payment monitoring will cease and all equipment owned by company should be returned in working order within ten (10) business days or cost of equipment will be added to account. For good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Municipality hereby consents to the Waste Contract Assignment and hereby agrees to the assignment from AllGreen Services to Atlantic Waste of all rights, obligations and benefits of the Waste Contract through the expiration date described in the Waste Contract. This Consent and Waiver, and the assignment and assumption contemplated hereby, shall not be effective until the closing of the Asset Sale. CONTRACT

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE FIRE DEPARTMENTS OF CANDLER COUNTY, GA. & THE CITY OF SWAINSBORO, GA.

This Agreement made and entered into this the first day of + 2020 to extend an agreement by and between the County Commissioners of the County of Candler County, Georgia and Mayor and Council of the City of Swainsboro Georgia; WITNESSETH: It is the purpose of this agreement to secure to each of the parties hereto and to pledge mutual aid in the protection of life and property from fire, and in firefighting;

It is agreed that:

- 1. Upon a request of a representative of Candler County, Georgia, by a representative of the City of Swainsboro, Georgia, firefighting equipment and personnel of Candler County Fire Department will be dispatched to any point within the area for which the City of Swainsboro normally provides fire protection, as designated by the representative of the Fire Department of the City of Swainsboro.
- 2. Upon request to a representative of the City of Swainsboro by representative of Candler County, firefighting equipment and personnel of the City of Swainsboro Fire Department will be dispatched to any point within the area for which the Fire Department of Candler County normally provides fire protection, as designated by the representative of Candler County.
- 3. Any dispatch of equipment and personnel pursuant to the agreement is subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) Any request for aid hereunder by either party shall include a statement of the amount and type of equipment and of personnel needed and shall specify the location to which the personnel and equipment are to be dispatched; however, the amount and type of equipment and number of personnel to be furnished shall be determined by a representative of the responding organization at the time of request.
 - (b) The responding organization shall report to the fire officer in charge of the requesting organization at the location to which the equipment is dispatched and shall be subject to the orders of that official until officially released.
 - (c) The responding organization shall be released by the requesting organization when the services of the responding organization are needed within the area for which it normally provides fire protection.
- 4. Each party to this agreement waives and renounces all claims against the other party for compensation for any loss, damage of personal injury or death occurring as a consequence of the performance of any of the conditions of this agreement.
- 5. Neither party shall be reimbursed by the other party for any cost incurred pursuant to this agreement.
- 6. All equipment used by the responding organization in carrying out the terms of this agreement will at the time of action hereunder, be owned by it, and personnel acting for the responding organization will at the time of such action be an employee or volunteer member of the fire department of the responding organization and familiar with the use and operation of the responding equipment.

7. The term of this agreement shall be until such time as (a) it is superseded by a subsequent agreement or (b) either party shall notify the other party by registered U.S. Mail of intent to cancel the agreement. Such cancellation notice shall be received at least thirty (30) days prior to effective date of cancellation.

- 1) 2020 Tax Digest/Tax Bills The City of Metter is scheduled to approve their roll-back millage rate on September 14, 2020. Once the millage is submitted to the Tax Commissioner the tax digest can be submitted to GA DOR for approval. She should be able to get tax bills out on time for payments to begin in November.
- 2) Hwy 121 Connector We are waiting on a design plan from the land owner to include in our submission to request funds from GDOT.
- 3) CARES Act 100% of CARES Act Phase I reimbursement funds were approved and deposited into the General Fund (\$345,390)
- 4) FY 2019 LMIG Safety Action Plan -
 - Signs Final Invoice was approved and paid
 - Striping Bid as part of 2020 LMIG; scheduled to begin within 90-120 days
- 5) 2020 TIA (Band 3) St. Matthew's Church Rd
 - County Attorney continues to work with residents on ROW acquisition.
 - We received an inflation adjustment from GDOT which will cover 100% of the anticipated construction costs.
- 6) **2020 TIA (Band 3)** Eden Church Rd
 - Road paving is complete; waiting on final striping
- 7) FY2021 LMIG Formula match amount is \$405,287.25 for FY2021. This is a decrease of \$63,101.95 or 13.5% from FY2020. We will request that EMC update the pavement evaluation so we can determine which projects to fund for FY2021.
- 8) FY2020 LMIG Projects selected were MacWac Rd and Covey Rd.
 - Project was awarded to Reeves Construction Company
 - Final contract has been executed; pending pre-construction meeting
- 9) TSPLOST2 -
 - Final projects recommendations have been made and will be submitted to the Regional Roundtable for approval. Candler's local projects (Hiawatha, Piney Grove, Lake Church) have made the list. However, the regional project for Portal Highway is not being recommended to the Regional Roundtable for approval.

10) 25 Daniel St (Adult Education Building) –

• Construction is complete and we have done the final walkthrough.

CANDLER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

Scheduled moving dates for the Tax Assessor (October 19th) and Tax Commissioner (October 20th) have been set.

11) Candler County Courthouse

- We have begun working on plans and pricing for courthouse renovations to take place after the Daniel St. building is complete
- 12) UGA Extension Office Angie Daughtry, County Extension Coordinator and 4H Coordinator, has notified us of her intent to retire effective September 30, 2020.
- 13) Telecommunications Tower (Hwy 23 N near Lambs Bridge Rd) Providence Real Estate Consulting has notified us of its intent to co-locate cellular equipment on the existing tower. We are waiting on required documentation and the fee to be submitted.
- 14) Candler County Hospital See attached financial reports. The hospital is working on completing entrance ramp improvements. In addition, they have purchased a CT scanner (\$941,000, \$11,200/mo., 84 mo.) and an MRI (\$1.6 Million, \$18,760/mo., 84 mo.).
